


The Leader


- One who guides or directs

- To what particular *purpose*?




Mental Health Nursing

" (which involves) carrying out a number of defensive, custodial, uncritical and often iatrogenic practices and treatments, based on a false epistemology and misrepresentation of what are, by and large, 'human problems of being' rather than so-called 'mental illnesses'"

US Professor

"(MHN) a specialty craft that operates primarily by working alongside people with mental health problems"

US Professor

"helping individuals and their families find ways of coping with the here and now (and past); helping people discover and ascribe individual meaning to their experiences"

US Professor

"exploring opportunities for recovery, reclamation and personal growth all through the medium of the therapeutic relationship"

English Leader

"a broad and moveable spectrum of roles, responsibilities and practices, defined by the economics, institutions and policies of the day".


